<u>Hope:</u> In Operation 180, hope is defined as: <u>Confident trust with the</u> expectation of fulfillment.

Hope is rooted in a confident and expectant trust that something we cannot see will come true or be fulfilled. As this lesson's scripture says, we have hope in heaven even though we cannot see it. This is because of the truth we can see and hear in the Word of God. Our hope begins the first time we hear the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
